Who are mandated reporters?

Mandated reporters are people who have regular contact with vulnerable people and are therefore legally required to ensure a report is made when abuse is observed or suspected. A recent statewide survey conducted by NCA and Crimes Against Children Research Center at the University of New Hampshire found that there were barriers to reporting.

The research indicated that "making a report would not help the child" was the most common barrier to making a report. Mandated reporters also believed that "filing a case automatically meant that the child would be removed from their home."

Fact: Children are not automatically removed from their home.

Fact: Reporters can make an anonymous report.

Reporting abuse is a responsibility of anyone who suspects abuse or neglect. The CACSC multidisciplinary approach develops child-focused plans that prioritize the safety of the child in a nurturing environment. This can often happen in the child's home with appropriate training and support for the family. Please help us educate our community about the facts of reporting abuse and neglect.
