Neglect

If a child is in imminent danger, please call 911, and make a report with the Kansas Protection Report Center at 1-800-922-5330

Recognize:

- Neglect can manifest itself in many ways. Generally, neglect is defined as acts or omissions by a person responsible for the care of a child resulting in the likelihood of harm to the child.
- This includes failure to provide a child with clothing, food, or shelter either intentionally or due to lack of financial means of the child's parent or guardian.
- It also encompasses failure to treat a medical condition, failure to provide adequate supervision of a child, or failure to remove a child from an unsafe situation.

How NOT to respond:

- Do not lose your composure.
- Children rarely lie about being abused, don't try to determine if a disclosure is true.
- Do not confront the offender. This could be dangerous, and could interfere with the investigation.
- Do not use body language that could display anger or disappointment.
- Are you telling me the truth?
- Why did you let that happen?
- Why didn't you stop him/her?
- You must feel awful about that.
- He/She didn't mean to do that, let me know if it happens again.

How to Respond:

- Write down everything the child told you.
- Save all evidence of contact: emails, messages, photos etc
- I believe you.
- It's not your fault.
- I don't know what happens next, but I will help you.
- I'm glad you told me.
- I'm upset, but not at you.
